Frank Sanniola card #886 passed away suddenly on November 26 and recently retired Nick Mancusi also passed away in October. Our condolences to their families.

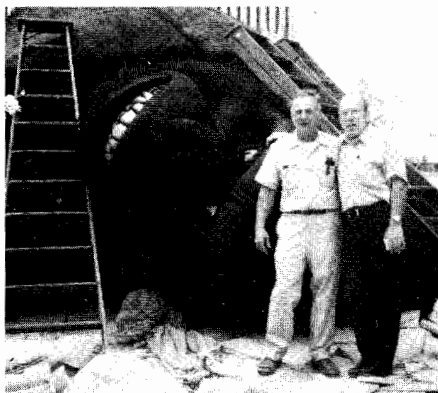
There will be no sick list printed this month.
